Study Hawai'i Speaker Series



In 2024, Study Hawai'i began its lunch time Speaker Series to help members improve their international outreach. The series premiered on October 16 with Dre Childs, the Social Media Coordinator from Study Hawai'i presenting on how to use social media to enhance international recruitment. The second speaker was Joseph Roos from the state Department of Business and Economic Development (DBEDT) on December 11. Dr. Roos presented the results of the 2024 International Student Survey and showed how to use those numbers to guide international student recruitment. The next speaker will be Vinnie Flores, the Regional Manager for Northeast Asia and the Pacific for EducationUSA. EdUSA, as part of the U.S. State Department, offers services to assist schools to expand international student recruitment. Mr. Flores will discuss ways schools can use EdUSA's services as well as recent student mobility trends in Asia and the Pacific and what challenges and opportunities those trends provide for Hawaii schools. Economic Impact Survey



One of Study Hawai'i's core beliefs is that international education provides important economic and sociocultural benefits to the State of Hawai'i. National surveys have often undercounted the true economic impact that international students bring to Hawai'i. For that reason, Study Hawai'i has partnered with DBEDT since 2009 to track the full amount of money brought to Hawaii by short and longterm international students. Working with economists from the Research & Economic Analysis Division of DBEDT, Study Hawai'i members provide data on the economic impact of these students. The findings are published in the fall of each year and provide clear data on the value of international education in our state, including state taxes and total jobs generated.

According to Joseph Roos from DBEDT, international education is a significant contributor to our state economy. In 2023 it generated \$188 million in direct spending into the state's economy. With a total of 8,311 students for calendar year 2023, this sector is a quiet but effective income generator. Spending on tuition, fees, and living expenses create ripple effects that impact numerous sectors of the state economy. The overall economic impact of international education in Hawai'i in 2023 was estimated to be about \$373 million and the sector supported more than 4,500 jobs. This is evidence that international education represents a viable alternative as an economic driver in the state's attempt to diversify from an over reliance on tourism.

Japan, South Korea and the Philippines were the three countries that sent the most students to Hawai'i in 2023. Japan has once again sent the most students accounting for 28% or 1,742 students in 2023. This is more than three times larger than South Korea, the country with the second largest number of students studying in Hawai'i.
